
Welcome to an experience for life


A great career starts here

Understand your choices

UCN offers three types of degree programmes. A 3½-year bachelor's degree programme, a 2-year academy profession degree programme and a top-up degree programme, turning the academy profession degree into a bachelor's degree with only 1½ years of additional study.

Here is a guide to help explain the different types of degrees and how to combine them to suit your needs and ambitions.





*Please note that upper secondary education may be termed differently in your country. Upper secondary education is usually the last step before higher education. Please also note that specific requirements vary from programme to programme. Find more information about admission requirements on page 58.



Bachelor's degree

A bachelor's degree at a university college is typically 3½ years of study, combining both theory and practice within its field.

The degree includes a compulsory internship in a business or organisation in Denmark or abroad for one semester.

The degree can be studied within a single field of study or as a combination of an academy profession degree (2 years) and a top-up degree (1½ years).

Bachelor's degree programmes:

- Architectural Technology and Construction Management
- Export and Technology Management



Academy profession degree

An academy profession degree is a 2-year programme that is typically aimed at a business or industrial career.

The academy profession degree programme combines theory with practice and includes a compulsory internship of approximately a half semester.

As an academy profession graduate, you may combine your degree with a compatible 1½-year top-up degree to achieve a bachelor's degree.

The colours indicate the top-up degree that each academy profession degree grants access to.

Top-up degree

A top-up degree is 1½ years of study that supplements an academy profession degree and makes it equal to a full bachelor's degree in quality and length.

The top-up degree programme combines theory with practice and includes a compulsory internship of approximately a half semester.

As an example, you may start out with an academy profession degree in Marketing Management and after graduation apply to a top-up programme to achieve a bachelor's degree in e.g. sport management.


A different way of learning

Depending on where you come from, you may find that the learning approach at UCN is somewhat different from what you are used to. It can take a little time to get the hang of it, but the feedback from our international students shows us that the learning approach is one of the things they often grow to love the most.

In general, education in Denmark is known for its innovative approach to learning, focusing greatly on building critical, analytical thinking and the ability to cooperate with others. Some of the most important skills for the labour market of the future.

At UCN, you will never work with theories just for the sake of following a curriculum. You will be presented with real-life situations and issues, and you will often collaborate with businesses and organisations on various projects. In teaching situations, we also keep a close eye on the most recent knowledge and research within a programme field.

Part of your studies will be scheduled lectures and classroom teaching. However, an equally large part of your studies will be case work, simulations, self-study, tours of various businesses, interdisciplinary studies as well as collaborative projects with your fellow students.





Learning hands-on

In the course of your studies, you will do a compulsory internship in a company or organisation in Denmark or abroad.

During the internship, you will experience what it is like to be part of the professional workforce within your field. You will get the opportunity to grow professionally, learn new things hands-on, and put all your acquired knowledge, skills and competencies into practice, taking you one step closer to your future work life.

Be an active UCN student

As a student at UCN, you will build a close bond with both lecturers and fellow students. It is expected that you attend and participate actively in class as a full-time student. We believe this is the best way for you to learn as much as possible.

As an international student in Denmark, you can expect world-class education – and active participation is the key when it comes to learning at UCN. This also means that it is your responsibility to make the most of your studies.

By combining theory with practice, we aim at giving you strong professional competences embedded in real life to make you innovative, independent and competent. At the same time, you can contribute to finding new solutions to the challenges and needs of your profession and the labour market.

UCN is a modern academic space for teaching. The facilities surrounding the classrooms are inspiring and lively with cosy corners where you can sit for a cup of coffee or do group work. Danish design dominates the buildings, the interior and furniture, making the environment very study-friendly. You will also find that the campus library is placed in quiet surroundings and stocks relevant literature and subscribes to a number of academic and business-oriented databases.

A lot of students on campus are of various nationalities, which contributes to the intercultural understanding and atmosphere – and you can attend the Talk Danish Café where you sit in a relaxed environment and simply speak the Danish language with either Danish students or fellow internationals. On campus you can also gather around a game of table tennis or pool during the breaks.

A thriving social life

Social life on all campuses is thriving, and there is plenty of opportunity to take a break from studies and attend one of the many social events, 'Friday bars' or student parties. It is very common for Danes to get together around a shared interest, sport or hobby, or to do volunteer work in the local community.

UCN offers many opportunities for you to get involved in life on campus. For example, you may sit on the UCN student council, join the volunteers running the student bar, or become an active member of one of the student sports clubs.



TIP! You can take Danish lessons while you are here. Most Danes speak English quite well, but understanding and speaking Danish will benefit you socially and particularly if you want to find a student job or a job after graduation, as it is often expected that you know some Danish.



Aalborg city life

With more than 118,000 inhabitants, Aalborg is Denmark's fourth largest city and the largest city in Northern Denmark. Approximately 25,000 students in higher education make Aalborg an exciting student city with lots to offer.

Aalborg is located by the Limfjord – and the city's waterfront which used to be the industrial heart is now a blooming part of the city centre where you will find world-class architecture, student housing, good restaurants, parks, shopping streets and an intimate, yet cosmopolitan atmosphere.





Aalborg has its own airport and offers a variety of events within sports, theatre, concerts and festivals. It is famous for its bustling night life, featuring the longest bar and night club street in Scandinavia, called Jomfru Ane Gade.

In addition, Aalborg Carnival is the largest carnival in Northern Europe with more than 60,000 participants. The Carnival takes place every year in late May and is a very popular event among UCN's students.

Architectural Technology and Construction Management

“The first reason why I started doing research among universities in Denmark was because of a few respectable architects that I know of who have finished their studies in this country. Then I found UCN through my research and the course – Architectural Technology and Construction Management. I saw that it was giving me what I wanted exactly, which was a more practical way of architecture than it being design-orientated.

The thing I like most about my studies at UCN is the freedom that this university provides the students and how professors treat the students like they are adults. The lecturers are more like mentors than normal professors who are just doing their job. They will guide you through the whole course, and also be a mentor, not only through the studies, but also in life aspects as well.

Aalborg is very lively on the weekends. UCN organises many different events and student-friendly parties, plus events that will help with job hunting, networking and more social skills.”

Architectural Technology and Construction Management

Do you see yourself developing, leading and managing large construction works?

As a Bachelor of Architectural Technology and Construction Management, you will be an expert in planning, designing and coordinating construction and building projects.

You will usually play a central role as project manager or site manager in a construction, engineering or architectural company. You will take part in the planning of construction projects from draft drawings to completed project designs, and you will typically contribute e.g. technical calculations to construction and project plans in the building process.

During the course of the study programme, you will learn about construction, materials selection, digital modelling and condition surveying as well as operating a business, project design and production, and much more.

You will have the opportunity to specialise in e.g. energy and sustainability, management or digital construction.

Please note that on completion of the first 1½ years (three semesters) of study, you can opt for either:

- An Academy Profession Degree in Construction Technology (2 years);
- A Bachelor's Degree in Architectural Technology and Construction Management (3½ years).

Automation Engineering

Do you want to excel at state-of-the-art automation and robotics?

As an AP Graduate in Automation Engineering, you will be able to create safe and innovative solutions for companies by developing and optimising their technical systems and automated facilities.

You will be in charge of practical work, including installing, programming, commissioning, optimising and operating automatic systems in technical production and manufacturing environments.

The programme will give you broad knowledge of the implementation and optimisation of various technical control systems and automated industrial facilities.

As an AP Graduate in Automation Engineering, you can work in both private and public companies, e.g. utility companies and industrial companies that manufacture and/or operate, e.g. wind turbines, pumps, robotic welding machines or flexible manufacturing systems (FMS).

Computer Science

Are you dreaming of a future as a software developer or software architect?

As an AP Graduate in Computer Science, you can design architecture and program IT systems, work with databases, and much more.

During the course of the study programme, you will gain an insight into the programming and creation of IT systems. You will also learn how to programme in Java and C#, as well as design databases that meet the requirements for good database design. At the same time, you will acquire an understanding of how a company works and how new IT systems can be introduced.

Toward the end of your studies, you will get an opportunity to specialise in a specific area, for instance in game or software development for mobile platforms.

As an AP Graduate in Computer Science, your future job title could be e.g. programmer, systems developer, web developer, network administrator, IT consultant or game developer.

As an AP Graduate in Computer Science, you can also choose to apply for admission to one of our top-up programmes to earn a bachelor's degree after an additional 1½ years of study. Please note that admission may be limited in some cases.

The Academy Profession Degree Programme in Design, Technology and Business is your chance to build on your creative talent and develop your graphic expertise while gaining an insight into the entire process from idea to finished product.

The programme combines practical work using graphic design software with a creative and aesthetic understanding of design processes. The first six months of the programme cover design, technology and business.

After this, you will continue on the graphics specialisation. As an AP Graduate in Design, Technology and Business, you can find employment in e.g. graphic design businesses, advertising agencies and marketing departments.

Do you want to develop the digital presence of companies and organisations? Do you want to work strategically with user-oriented design?

- Computer Science (page 26)

With 1½ years of additional study, you will earn a bachelor's degree in Digital Concept Development. Together with your academy profession diploma, this will shape your professional profile.

In the programme, you will achieve knowledge, skills and competencies in the strategic, operational and business aspects of digital concept development.

Furthermore, you will learn to develop concepts that combine different professional fields such as design and commerce, communication and marketing, concept and business development, user understanding, technology and project management.

As a Bachelor of Digital Concept Development, you will fit into many industries that already work with or need digital concepts. Examples of these could be advertising, design and web agencies as well as communication and marketing departments in businesses and organisations.

Multimedia Design

Is working with digital media your passion? Do you want to create the websites, apps and multimedia solutions of the future?

As an AP Graduate in Multimedia Design, you can single-handedly design, plan, implement and manage multimedia tasks.

The programme aims at giving students competencies in producing digital interfaces, primarily within the context of websites. Among other things, this implies an ability to do thorough user research, understand how digitalisation affects businesses and users, create rich and user-friendly interfaces and develop code and programme functionality.

The programme has a broad scope and bridges the gap between technical problem solving and creative skills through management of development processes.

As an AP Graduate in Multimedia Design, you may find work in the field of IT and media. Future job titles could be e.g. front-end developer, web designer or user experience (UX) researcher/designer.

As an AP Graduate in Multimedia Design, you can also choose to apply for admission to one of our top-up programmes, earning you a bachelor's degree after an additional 1½ years of study. Please note that admission may be limited in some cases.

This is a top-up programme intended for graduates of the Academy Profession Degree Programme in:

The top-up programme earns you a bachelor's degree in Software Development with only 1½ years of study.

This programme will give you in-depth understanding and knowledge of the technical and theoretical aspects of software development. You will learn to use different database types and how to develop existing systems further.

The programme includes subjects such as database types, the role of contracts in the system development process, methods and tools for integration between systems, project management, distributed design and development, configuration and release management as well as test models and test planning.

Software developers typically get jobs as system developers, software architects and project managers of large-scale IT projects in Denmark and abroad.

The top-up programme earns you a bachelor's degree in Web Development with 1½ years of additional study.

As a Bachelor of Web Development, you will have the basis for working with modern web technologies and coding practices throughout the development process.

As part of your studies, you will also work on database and deployment technologies and on the general development process from a design perspective.

The programme will give you the competencies to work with the construction of modern web applications. You will acquire skills and knowledge of web technologies in a broad sense, both desktop, mobile etc., and you will find exciting employment opportunities within a rapidly growing industry.

As a graduate of the Bachelor's Degree Programme in Export and Technology Management, you understand that effective technology is required to develop safe and successful products.

You can develop marketing strategies that ensure that global sales targets are met. You will be ready to handle cultural differences and take part in internal sales processes and be part of the globalisation of markets.

Using your understanding of technology, you can contribute to the development of new products. You are knowledgeable about design, quality, development, production planning and the day-to-day operations of a company.

As a Bachelor of Export and Technology Management, you may find employment in Danish or international companies.

The top-up programme earns you a bachelor's degree in international hospitality management with only 1½ years of additional study.

The programme will provide you with the competencies to work in day-to-day operations, development, administration and management in an international work environment in the hospitality industry. A specialisation period will allow you to focus on either tourism, the hotel and restaurant industry or the experience economy.

You will learn about management, strategy, economics, cultural awareness and customer relations. You will be provided with the tools to develop new markets and concepts, achieve an understanding of a company's strategic challenges as well as the ability to handle the practical implementation of a company strategy.

For Danish students, the first semester will be taught in Danish, before the programme continues fully taught in English from the second semester. For international students, all semesters are fully taught in English.

The programme opens the door to a broad range of job opportunities in the service industry, such as at hotels, restaurants, travel agencies and amusement parks, event management agencies as well as holiday and conference centres, sport clubs and associations.

Are you dreaming of a career in the sport, event and leisure industry?

This is a top-up programme intended for graduates of the Academy Profession Degree Programmes in:

- Service, Hospitality and Tourism Management (page 46)
- Marketing Management (page 42)

The top-up programme earns you a bachelor's degree in Sport Management with only 1½ years of additional study.

The programme is also intended for people with relevant experience and a background in the industry.

As a Bachelor of Sport Management, you will have a thorough understanding of the commercial mechanisms in the sport, event and leisure industry.

The programme covers the following themes within the sport, event and leisure industry: Sport industry, Sport product and sport consumer, Sustainable business operations, Strategic value creation and an elective. The subjects are: sport marketing, sport management, sport law, sport economics, and academic methods and research.

On graduation, you will be able to find employment in various businesses and organisations in the sport, event and leisure industry. You might work as a project manager, event coordinator, administrator, marketing and sales coordinator, consultant, etc.

1. Denmark is a small country in Scandinavia, and it is one of the world's oldest monarchies.
2. Denmark is a member of the EU, but still has its own currency (Danish Kroner or DKK).
3. No place in Denmark is more than 50 km from the sea.
4. Denmark has 406 islands and the highest point in the country is only 170 metres above sea level.
5. Denmark is one of the world's largest exporters of wind turbines.
6. Many Danes prefer going to work by bicycle rather than by car.
7. Denmark is often cited as one of the world's best countries to live in.
8. Denmark has a strong welfare state ensuring economic equality and close to no corruption.
9. Danes may seem reserved at first, but are friendly and helpful with a good sense of humour.





Coming to Denmark

In the process of making the decision to study at UCN, you will naturally have a lot of questions about all the practicalities. Here are some of the answers.

Do I need a student visa/residence permit?


If you are a citizen of the EU/EEA or Switzerland, you can live, work and study in Denmark under the EU regulations on freedom of movement and do not need a visitor's visa, residence or work permit. However, you should obtain an EU residence document (registration certificate) from the State Administration after arrival. UCN will support you in this process.

If you are a citizen of a country outside the Nordic countries or the EU/EEA, you must hold a residence permit in order to reside and study in Denmark. You must obtain the permit before you arrive in Denmark, and the processing time is approximately two months.

After you get admitted to a programme and pay the tuition fees for the first semester, UCN will start its part of the student visa procedure.

Will I need to find my own housing?

Denmark does not have a tradition for on-campus housing as they do in other parts of the world. UCN will do its best to help international students get ready for their stay in Aalborg. However, all incoming students are required to find their own accommodation.

Aalborg is a very popular destination for studying, and it is important that you begin your search for accommodation as soon as you have decided to study in Denmark. Apart from certain dormitories, most flats for rent in Denmark are offered unfurnished.

Temporary housing guarantee

The Municipality of Aalborg offers students a temporary housing guarantee of three months, giving you time to find a place to live. To be covered by the housing guarantee, you must have registered with AKU-Aalborg, which assigns dormitories and youth housing. It is free to register. www.aku-aalborg.dk

Tips on finding accommodation

It is always challenging to find the right accommodation, but Aalborg is the city in Denmark that has the highest number of inexpensive student housing units.

UCN cooperates with the dormitory UC House, which offers furnished rooms in a social environment with common facilities such as table tennis and a pool table.

A lot of students also prefer to share a flat, which can be both economically and socially wise.

Your living expenses

Can I afford to live in Aalborg?

Denmark is an expensive country, but the standard of living is also among the highest in the world. However, if you follow local customs and economise – such as cycling to UCN and eating at home – life in Denmark should not blow your budget.

Your living expenses will naturally depend on your lifestyle and habits, but to give you an idea of what your average monthly expenses will be, here is a rough budget:

| Expense type | approx. cost per month |

| Rent for a shared flat in Aalborg (utilities are usually included) | 2,500-3,500 DKK |
| Insurance | 200 DKK |
| Multimedia licence | 160 DKK |
| Mobile phone | 150 DKK |
| Food | 1,500 DKK |
| Transportation | 300 DKK |
| Other personal expenses | 700 DKK |
| Total | 6,000 DKK |

Can I get a job while studying?

At UCN, we offer assistance in your job search in the form of job seminars and CV workshops where we provide helpful advice, tips and tricks. To start, it may be easier to get jobs such as babysitting, cleaning, housekeeping, waitering and delivering papers.

Many students in Denmark have part-time jobs alongside their studies and/or full-time jobs during the summer holidays. This can be a good way to cover your living expenses, build your network or practice certain skills. However, it is important to remember that you are here to study, and that your permit to reside in Denmark relies on you being a dedicated student who actively follows your study programme, does your homework and passes the exams.

A student job salary varies between 10 and 14 Euro per hour.

EU/EEA and Swiss citizens can work in Denmark under the EU rules regarding the free movement of workers with no restriction on the number of working hours. Non-EU/EEA citizens may work in Denmark for up to 20 hours a week and full-time during June, July and August.

How to apply for admission

To seek admission for a UCN degree, go to the UCN website and find out exactly how to apply for the programme that you are interested in.

Please note: the exact guidelines and documentation requirements vary from programme to programme, so please visit the specific programme's page on our website where we will guide you through the procedure.

Tuition fees

Tuition fees for non-EU/non-EEA citizens vary from 3,600 to 6,300 EUR per semester depending on the programme.

You will find an updated and programme-specific list of tuition fees on our website.

An application fee of 100 EUR also applies to non-EU/EEA students who need a study permit. If you are accepted for studies at UCN, we will deduct the application fee from the tuition fee for the first semester. If you are not accepted, the application fee will not be reimbursed.

As part of the Danish welfare and taxation system, education is free of charge, and by EU law, students from EU/EEA countries may study in Denmark under the same terms and conditions as Danish citizens.


